
All suggestions gratefully received and if anybody would like to volunteer to write some content, that would be wonderful!

On Wednesday 1 May, the Church will close earlier at 1215.






BOOK AND READING DISCUSSION GROUP

The Book Group will be meeting again on Thursday 23 May at 2.30pm in Willows Café, Brook Street, Broughty Ferry. New members are most welcome. The book under discussion will be 'Slow Horses by Mike Herron.

The Slough House books follow a group of MI5 spies who've been relegated to a shabby, dead-end office because they've each made serious, career-ending mistake. They've been written off as useless, but the

truth is that many are much more competent than their assignment might suggest. This first entry in the series introduces us to the characters in Slough House – the place where failed spies go to run out the clock on their careers. For the most part, they do low-stakes busy work with no real significance. That all changes when a young man is abducted, and his kidnappers threaten to broadcast his beheading live on the internet. The slow horses see connections between the case and what they've been observing; a perfect opportunity to try and redeem themselves.
