Last Sunday, St. Paul's Cathedral, Dundee hosted a special service to celebrate the links between Dundee and Nablus in the West Bank in Israel-Palestine. Fr Jamil, his wife Loma and daughter from St Philip's Nablus joined us to mark the 45 year-old civic twinning and 5 year-old Anglican link between St Philip's in the occupied West Bank and Canon Kerry Dixon and all at St Luke's Downfield in Dundee. The choir of St. Paul's was joined by the Music Group of St. Luke's for a splendid worship performance.
